## **QUILT PROJECT**

Plainfield Church Quilters have been busy using their various talents to craft quilts that will share warmth and love in the greater Upper Valley community.

Under the direction of Sandra Yeaton, PCQ have crafted 40 quilts since the fall. Joy Hutchins has machine-pieced the majority of tops from her scrap stash. Tops, batting, and backs then make “quilt sandwiches” which are hand-tied and bound with machine-stitched binding.

As the PCQ project unfolded, Sandra thought about veterans living in tents in WRJ. She says, “I wanted the quilts to go to homeless vets and that started a search.”

Deb Ryan assumed the role of searcher. She contacted the WRJ police and discovered that the veterans who were living in tents had been moved to warmer accommodations for the winter. Deb then called the VA hospital where she eventually was put into communication with PCQ’s current contact. Through discussion with the VA contact, PCQ learned that there were female homeless veterans among those living in tents. Some had children with them.

Thirty-five bigger quilts and five baby quilts were recently taken to the VA hospital in WRJ where they will be distributed to homeless veterans or to veterans who are starting out in a home or apartment with little or nothing. PCQ is grateful that all of their quilts will receive a home.

Perhaps you would like to join the PCQ mission. If you would like to help tie quilts, the group meets Friday mornings at the fire station. Perhaps you would like to sew a top or two from material in your stash. Perhaps you have some old blankets or sheets that can be repurposed into batting or backing. March 10 starts Daylight Savings Time! Spring your clocks ahead one hour before you go to bed on Saturday... or risk being late for church worship on Sunday!

## **PASTOR’S PONDERINGS – GAINING FROM SACRIFICE**

Just as Advent is a season of preparation before Christmas, Lent is a season of preparation before Easter. Many Christians practice certain spiritual disciplines during Lent such as fasting, devotional reading or prayer. Although fasting is most commonly thought of as a food related practice, it does not have to be. There are other ways in which you can practice Lent. You could give up social media, television, or other activities that can be distracting. You can also add something to your daily practice like reading or some sort of hand-work, like knitting, quilting, painting, sculpting, etc.

One of the ideas of Lent is to realize our mortality. When we stop to think about how short our time is here on Earth, it brings things into perspective and causes us to see the value in serving others, helping our neighbor, and making the world a better place.

I think when we shift our thoughts from ‘what am I giving up’, to ‘what am I gaining’, we find that by giving something up, we gain. We grow spiritually and we often make someone else’s life better as well. For example, if I give up watching a few hours of TV to go serve food at a homeless shelter, then I am growing spiritually, and I am making someone feel loved and valued.

So, for Lent think about what you and others might gain from giving something up. One thing Jesus taught us was that sacrifice yields huge, even cosmic, rewards.

## **HOLIDAY HISTORY**

**Shrove Tuesday** a/k/a “Mardi Gras.” In Christianity Mardi Gras (French for “Fat Tuesday”) is celebrated on the last day before the beginning of Lent (the period of fasting and repentance between Ash Wednesday and Easter). Traditionally, rich foods such as eggs, meat, oils and butter were strictly prohibited during the 40 days of Lent. It thus became customary to have a feast on the day before the 40-day fast in order to empty the house of any of these foods. (Source:<http://www.religionfacts.com/mardi-gras>)

**Ash Wednesday**, also known as the Day of Ashes, begins the 40-day period of fasting and abstinence before Easter. Christians have their foreheads marked with ashes in the shape of a cross on that day. The ashes traditionally come from the burning of the previous year’s palms from Palm Sunday. The name ‘Day of Ashes’ comes from “Dies Cinerum.” Though the exact origin of the day is not clear, the custom of marking the head with ashes on this day is said to have originated during the papacy of Pope Gregory (590-604). **St. Patrick’s Day** celebrates the Roman Catholic feast day of the patron saint of Ireland who died on March 17, 461. But did you know that he wasn’t even Irish? He was born in Roman Britain, was kidnapped into slavery and brought to Ireland. Patrick escaped to a monastery in Gaul (France), converted to Christianity, and went back to Ireland in 432 as a missionary. Tradition has it that Patrick confronted the Druids at Tara and abolished their pagan rites. He became a bishop and

after his death was named Ireland's patron saint. However, celebrations in Ireland were minimal. Emigration from Ireland to America led to bigger celebrations and parades so the Irish could stay connected with their roots. Eighteenth century Irish soldiers who fought in the Revolutionary War held the first St. Patrick Day parades. (Source: <http://www.gpb.org/education/origins-of-st-patricks-day>)
